## If V-Go® irritates your skin or leaves residue...



#### Skin irritation

If the area of skin around V-Go is red and sore to the touch, it may be irritated. There are a number of skin barrier products available to help prevent irritation and/or to treat sensitivity problems.

Skin may become irritated by the adhesive pad on V-Go or by the way V-Go is positioned on your skin.



Your doctor may be able to recommend prescription products for your specific situation.



Infections at the application site may also occur. If you experience redness, irritation, or inflammation around V-Go (specifically at the end closest to the needle), immediately replace V-Go with a new one on a different body site. **Contact your doctor or healthcare professional for the best way to treat infection and irritation**, especially if the inflamed site appears bigger than a dime.

#### Adhesive residue

- You might try using a skin barrier product to protect your skin before applying V-Go
- Ensure any prior residue is removed before applying a new V-Go

Before applying V-Go, apply alcohol or an antiseptic skin cleanser to provide a clean surface.

# Where to apply V-Go

Getting V-Go to stick starts with proper application.

- Choose a location that remains flat when you are sitting down, standing up, or lying down
- Be sure you can see the grey indicator in the viewing window and reach all of the buttons



### Where not to apply V-Go

- On a fold of skin, muscle, or bone
- On excessively scarred, wet, sweaty, or oily skin
- Within a 1-inch radius of your belly button
- In excessively hair-covered locations
- In areas that interfere with clothing or in areas of stretching



### Preparing the application site

- Apply alcohol or an antiseptic skin cleanser to provide a clean surface
- Avoid using lotions or creams in the area
- You can try using barrier products to protect skin before applying V-Go



If necessary, shave hair on application site for a smooth surface.

### **Applying V-Go**

- Hold V-Go and remove the liner. Be careful not to touch the sticky side of the adhesive
- Press for 10 seconds and run finger along the edges to secure



Select the application site while sitting; apply V-Go while standing.
